### **DUMPSTER-SHREDDER DAY**

The dumpster and shredder will be located on Queen Anne RD on Saturday, September 24<sup>th</sup> from 9am – 11am. **The dumpster is available to all residents of Villa Nova. Dumpster prohibited items** include: hazardous wastes; Freon; batteries; paint; chemicals; infectious, medical & animal wastes; explosive/flammable materials; oil & antifreeze; drums & tanks; tree stumps/logs;

concrete/stones >18inches; asbestos shingles; recyclable material including glass & metal; computers, monitors, printers, scanners & cables; tires/rims; fax machines, telephones & answering machines; and very heavy items. Please do not dump trash/recyclables that are picked up curbside by our normal refuse collection.

The shredder is FREE to VNCA dues paying members.

### **WEST NILE, ZIKA VIRUSES**

**REMINDER...PLEASE REMOVE ANY STANDING WATER**. Standing water breeds mosquitoes. Infected mosquitoes spread West Nile and Zika viruses.

West Nile virus (WNV) is most commonly transmitted to humans by mosquitoes. There are no medications to treat or vaccines to prevent WNV infection. Fortunately, most people infected with WNV will have no symptoms. About 1 in 5 people who are infected will develop a fever with other symptoms. Less than 1% of infected people develop a serious, sometimes fatal, neurologic illness.

The U.S. had its first Zika-related death in June. Zika is almost never fatal, but it's been known to kill people. The virus, spread by the bite of an infected *Aedes* species mosquito, is not yet spreading in the United States but health officials say thousands of people have carried it back with them from affected countries in Central and South America. The most common symptoms of Zika are fever, rash, joint pain, or conjunctivitis (red eyes). Other common symptoms include muscle pain and headache.
